**Activities for Faculty:**

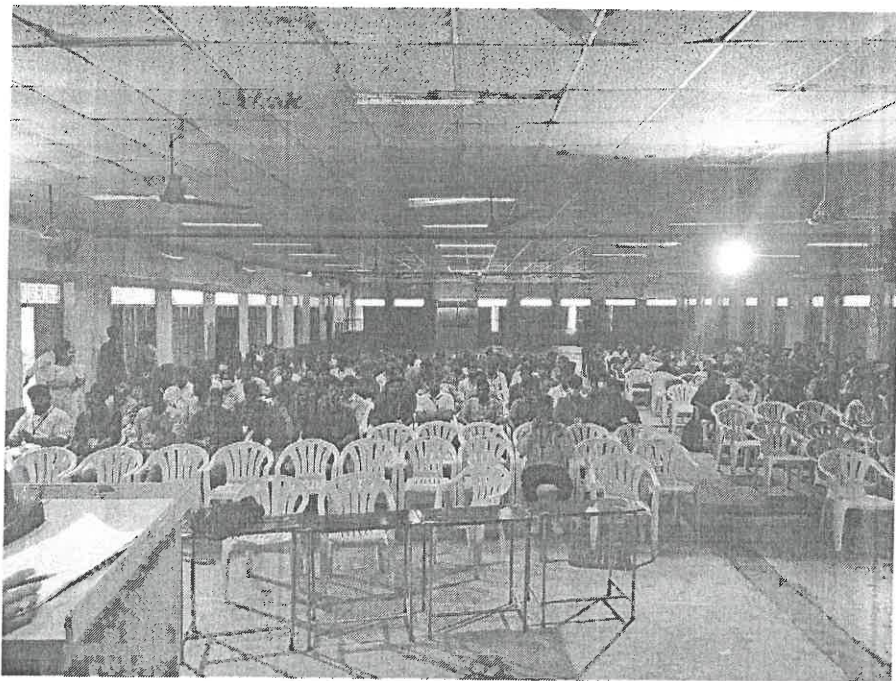
